

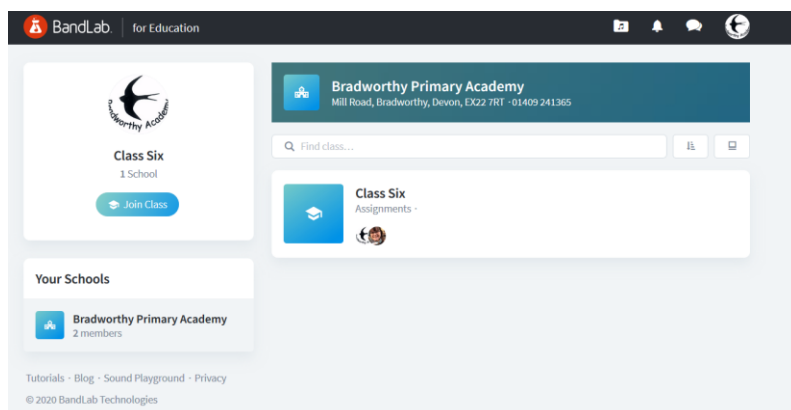
## BandLab: How To Guide!

You can access your bandlab account using the following details:

Class Five – [class5@bradworthy.devon.sch.uk](mailto:class5@bradworthy.devon.sch.uk) (Password: Bradworthy)

Class Six – [class6@bradworthy.devon.sch.uk](mailto:class6@bradworthy.devon.sch.uk) (Password: Bradworthy)


Once you are in, you should see the screen below.



When you have been set an assignment, they will appear in the Assignments box, which will open to show your more details of the task.

**Mr Blue Sky**

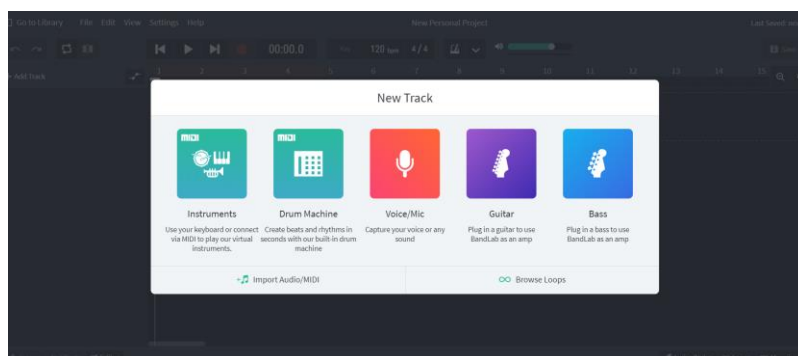
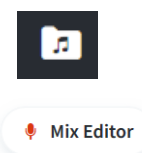

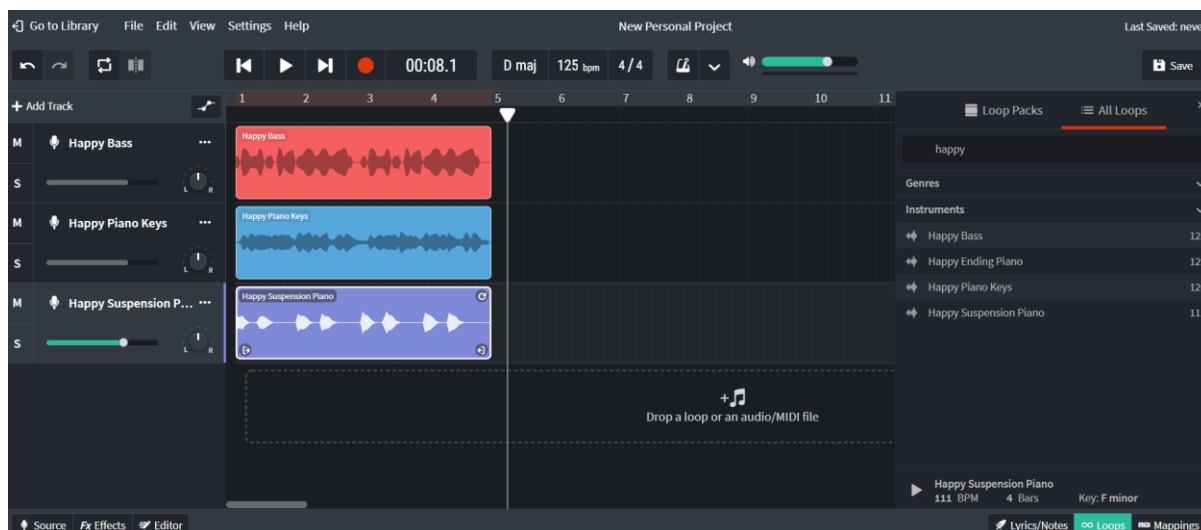
This is the task that links to your online learning over the Easter break. You can view the video as many times as you like, and then have a go at creating something uplifting!!

Once you have read the assignment and want to get started, you need to click on the library symbol on the top of the screen.

This will open the class library, where everyone's musical creations will be stored. To start creating something of your own, click on the Mix Editor button, which will appear in your library.



From here you can browse the 'loops' or input music you are playing yourself. The loops are created in blocks, which stack on top of each other, or beside each other to create a piece of music. Clicking 'Browse Loops' will open a pop up screen on the bottom left of the screen which shows all of the loops you can choose from.



You can then drag and drop loops in to your piece of music. You can repeat loops, cut them, mirror them, and basically do anything you like to them!

Remember to save your composition (use your name and a title, for example, 'Mrs T Happy Song'), and it will then be held in the library for your class.

Have a play, explore the site and see what you can come up with.
