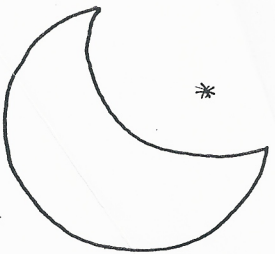
In writing an ordinary oo is used.



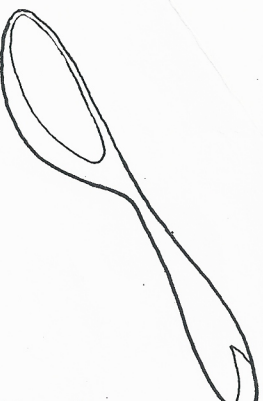
